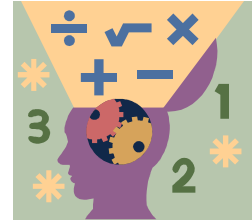


# Algebra 1P with Mrs. Baker

This is a challenging High School course designed, so that if successfully completed, students will move onto Algebra 2 or Honors Algebra 2. Those students going on to San Joaquin Memorial must challenge Algebra 1 in May or June.



## Materials

- 300+ spiral notebook for note taking and homework
- Chapter Packets for teaching and reinforcement
- 2 pencils at All Times
- hand-held sharpener
- yellow highlighter
- Text: **Algebra 1: Glencoe/McGraw Hill Common Core Edition**

## Homework/Classwork

- Students will have 15-20 minutes to begin their homework.
- Will be given nightly with a lighter assignment on Fridays.
- I usually assign odd problems so students can check their progress instead of staying “stuck”.
- Problems are to be written down and showing each step with the answer highlighted. This will hopefully eliminate any “cheating” which won’t help them on the tests anyway.

## Testing

- Quizzes are given midway through a chapter and consist of 10 to 15 questions.
- Review tests for practice are given prior to a chapter test. They are challenging but very helpful.

## Grading

- 50 % of grade is tests
- 25% of grade is quizzes
- 25% of grade is homework completeness and practice test percents

95-100% = A

90-94% = A-

87-89% = B+

83-86% = B

80-82% = B-

77-79% = C+

73-76% = C

70-72% = C-

60-69% = “D Range”

Below 60% is Failing

An extra honor roll point is added to the student’s grade so that an A is 6 points, an A- is 5 and so on.
