



CODE OF CONDUCT

READ TO ALL TEAM MEMBERS

In order to provide an atmosphere of fun and sportsmanship, certain regulations are necessary and must cover all who are connected with the program. Violations of these simple acts of good sportsmanship and common courtesy will not be permitted to destroy the activity.

No person in the program should be guilty of the following:

1. A physical attack or any other aggressive action toward an official, spectator, or other player.
2. Use of profane, obscene or derogatory remarks to an official, spectator, or other player, or speaking or acting in such a manner to cause a disturbance.
3. Forcefully refuse to abide by an official's decision in a contest, causing a delay.
4. Unnecessary throwing of equipment or any other object.
5. Play in such a rough manner to deliberately try to cause bodily injury to another player.
7. Cause defacement or destruction to any public facility or equipment.

The penalty for violation of the above regulations may result in:

- A. Ejection from the game and/or forfeiture of the game AND/OR
- B. Probation for the season, AND/OR
- C. Suspension for one or more games during the season and/or the entire athletic year.

The right to appeal a decision may be submitted in writing by the player, manager, or coach involved in the decision within thirty days to the Supervisor in charge.

MANAGER'S AGREEMENT

Upon filing and the acceptance in the St. Anthony's Community Center League and an official roster for any recreation athletic event, the manager hereby affirms that each *team member has read and will abide by the Code of Conduct*. The manager is responsible for their team, and for all actions that violate the policies, rules, regulations, and Code of Conduct set forth by the St. Anthony's Community Center.

Basketball Rules

I. Team & Player Eligibility

- A. No player under 18 years of age will be allowed to participate and no high school students are eligible to play.
- B. All players must appear on the team roster to be eligible to play.
- C. All players must sign an injury waiver.
- D. The League Director has the authority to make final rulings regarding eligibility and roster procedures.

II. Pre-Game Rules

- A. League starts at 6:30 p.m. Teams must be ready to play by 6:30. Doors will open by 6:15 every league night.
- B. Home team and schedule will be determined by the League Director and posted at the scorers table.
- C. Team with bye keeps score. If there is not a team with a bye each team must provide a player to keep score for their game.
- D. There will be a 4 minute break between games. Please be ready to play when the horn sounds.

III. Officials

- A. There are no officials during league so please practice good sportsmanship.
- B. Please keep the game moving.
- C. Offensive players call their own shooting fouls.
- D. Please practice good sportsmanship in regard to other violations. See letter III. B.
- E. The League Director has the final say in any dispute.

IV. Gameplay

- A. Unless stated otherwise, official CIF boys' high school rules govern league play.
- B. Teams may start the game with 4 players. If 4 players are present at game time, the game will proceed. If less than four players are available, the team forfeits, but may choose to pick up players from another team.
- C. Each game will last 12 minutes with a running clock. The clock does not stop for any reason.
- D. The home team starts with the ball.
- E. All dead balls must be checked at the top of the key to resume play.
- F. Offensive players call shooting fouls against them. If the basket is made, play continues. If the basket is missed, the team may choose to take one point or possession at the top of the key. No free throws.
