Red Ribbon Week is the oldest and largest drug prevention campaign in the country; it serves as a vehicle for communities and individuals to take a stand for the hopes and dreams of our children through a commitment to drug prevention and education and a personal commitment to live drug-free lives. Red Ribbon Week was begun in 1985 to honor DEA Agent Enrique Camarena who was killed in the line of duty. It started with red ribbons being worn by the residents of his hometown, Calexico, CA. The following year the California State PTA adopted the Red Ribbon Campaign. In 1988, Red Ribbon Week was recognized nationally with President Ronald Reagan and First Lady Nancy Reagan serving as the Honorary Chairs. Many thanks to the members of Student Government and their moderators – Mrs. Asparuhov, Mrs. Tuel, and Mr. Gonzalez – for coordinating the activities of this week. Scrip News

Since July 1, St. Anthony's has been using a new system for our Scrip program, ordering through Shop With Scrip.com, also known as Great Lakes Scrip Co. This system offers online ordering, payment directly from your bank account through PrestoPay, and many options for online scrip. All your favorite physical cards are available as well. Please note that this is the primary way for you to earn tuition credit! A secondary method is to enroll your telephone number with SaveMart and FoodMaxx's SHARES program. The SHARES program is operated by a

different company, called eScrip, that also offers a scrip program. However, this program does not offer the same rebate percentages. If you enroll your phone number to use the SHARES program, eScrip will ask you to enroll in their "Benefit Mobile" program. THIS IS NOT THE SAME AS OUR PREFERRED VENDOR: SHOP WITH SCRIP. Apple Watches / Prescribed Medication for Students / Supervision Before and After School

A few reminders regarding school policies:

- Due to the potential to access to online sites, and because they are expensive items that could be damaged or lost at school, Apple watches are not allowed to be worn or brought to school by SAS students.

- Please notify the front office if your child is bringing any prescribed medication to school. ***There is a form that must be filled out by parents for all prescribed medication to be on campus.***
- All students must be supervised when on campus before and after school. ***Students on campus before 8:00 A.M., and after 3:10 P.M. who are not participating in an adult-supervised after-school activity, will be sent to Campus Care.*** This includes students who are waiting for siblings who are in an after-school activity. A fee will be charged for the time they are present until they are signed out by a parent/guardian. ***Parent cooperation with this supervision policy is mandatory.*** Please let your children know that our intent is not to contradict your request, but rather concern for their safety. Sometimes unexpected things happen which delay even the best of intentions to promptly pick up your child from school. Our goal is to provide a safe environment and adult supervision until you do arrive. Campus Care Drop-In Rates: \$5 per child for the Morning Session, \$10 per child from 3:10 to 6:00 P.M.

Parking Lot Reminders

- **Do not cut off cars on the Maroa side drop-off or the front parking lot drop-off by going around them on the left-hand side – this poses a major danger should a passenger door be opened on that side as you are going by.** Please wait your turn until the car in front of you moves on. **When dropping off your child in these areas, please ask them to exit the car on the right-hand side only.** This will assist in keeping them safe from any cars not following the procedure and pulling around your car.
- The front aisle in the main parking lot is blocked off and is a **pedestrian-only zone**. **Drop-off or pick-up of students is never allowed in this area.**
- **Be mindful of our 5 MPH speed limit.** To keep our students safe, please drive slowly. We ask that pedestrians use the crosswalks.
- If you are dropping off or picking up children **by the dumpsters in the front lot, pull all the way forward.** If the child you want to pick up is not present, you must leave these zones and go around or park. Please be cautious and kind in the parking lot. Patience is always appreciated.
- **No parking is allowed along the wood fence in the front parking lot.** This greatly impedes the flow of traffic for drop-off and pick-up, and is a safety concern for our students.
- The glass door on the Maroa side of the school is no longer open during morning drop-off. Students who are dropped off must walk along the building to the front gate of the school to enter. **Please pull all the way forward to help the morning drop-off go smoothly.**
- If you pick up your child at the Browning gate after school, **please park on the north side of the street, next to the school, so that students do not have to cross the street.**
- **Soccer season safety:** It is soccer season, and each day after school there are many students and family members on our field for soccer practices and games. **Please do not drive onto the school property near our soccer field while practices or games are in progress.**

Custodial Paperwork Request

For the appropriate procedures to be followed by the school staff, the school must have on file any court document that specifies current custodial arrangements for any of our students. Please make a copy and deliver it to the office staff. If custodial arrangements should change, please make sure the school has a copy of the new court document. Thank you for your cooperation with this important request.

Please do not send us any offering. You have blessed us in the past with your prayers and support, and we would like this to be our gift to you.

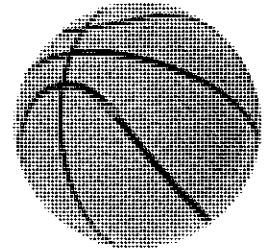
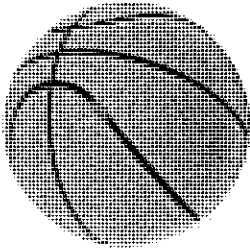
