Scrip News – Holiday Deadlines

The holidays are fast approaching! Please plan ahead in ordering your scrip for Thanksgiving, Christmas, and the New Year. Please note the deadlines to guarantee your scrip needs, whether gift cards or “gift of scrip” certificates.

- **Thanksgiving Scrip Deadline is Monday, November 13 by noon.**
- **Christmas Scrip Deadline is Monday, December 11 by noon.**
- **The last day to order Gift of Scrip Certificates is Friday, December 15.**
- **The Scrip office will not be open during Thanksgiving or Christmas break.**

Since July 1, St. Anthony’s has been using a new system for our Scrip program, ordering through ShopWithScrip.com, also known as Great Lakes Scrip Co. This system offers online ordering, payment directly from your bank account through PrestoPay, and many options for online scrip. All your favorite physical cards are available as well. Please note that this is the primary way for you to earn tuition credit! A secondary method is to enroll your telephone number with SaveMart and FoodMaxx’s SHARES program. The SHARES program is operated by a different company, called eScrip, which also offers a scrip program. However, this program does not offer the same rebate percentages. If you enroll your phone number to use the SHARES program, eScrip will ask you to enroll in their “Benefit Mobile” program. THIS IS NOT THE SAME AS OUR PREFERRED VENDOR: SHOP WITH SCRIP. 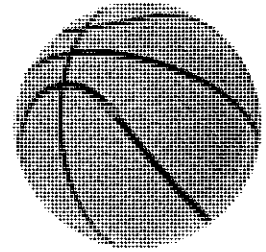
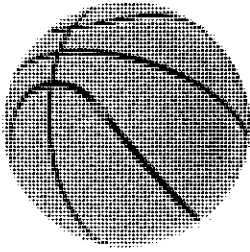
