- **Communicate:** You might say something like, "It's important to dad and I that you do well in Math. We are confident you can raise your grade above a C."

Make sure to communicate often with your child and with your child's teacher. Let us know how we can help support the goals you have set in your family.

4. After the event, collect any outstanding pledges. All pledges must be turned in to school by Wednesday after Thanksgiving in order to receive a t-shirt.
5. Each student collecting at least \$35.00 in total pledges will receive a Raider Run T-shirt. Each family collecting at least \$70 in total pledges will guarantee a T-shirt for each student in the family.

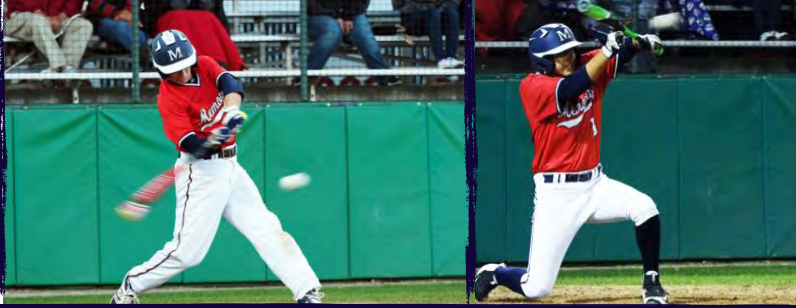
