Security Committee
Minutes from January 27, 2016

Committee Members present: Mrs. Susannah Nelson, Monica Baker, Zetta Haden, Kara Smith, Mike Chielpagian (Chair)

Audience present: Moira Gordillo-Amu, Chris Oberti, Jessica Marshall, Vince Marshall, Jenna Oberti

Meeting called to order at 5:30 P.M.

Prayer offered by Mike Chielpagian.

Introductory comments by Mike Chielpagian:

The purpose of this committee is to facilitate communication between parents and the administration regarding security issues. This committee will report back to the Saint Anthony's Advisory School Board and the Saint Anthony's School administration. This committee will not discuss specific students or specific incidents.

Mrs. Nelson's report on recent changes concerning security:

1. Extra supervision is being given to second graders going from class to Campus Care.
2. There is a staff member assigned to bathroom supervision between 2:50 and 3:10 P.M.
3. Campus Care now has a "bathroom pass" system (like that used during regular school hours) whereby one student is allowed to go to the bathroom at a time.
4. The teachers and staff members were informed about the reported incident and asked to be extra vigilant on supervision.
5. Campus Care uses the blue dividers daily so that students can no longer go onto the stage or into the kitchen area.
6. One member of Campus Care is assigned to come to the courtyard at 3:10 P.M. to assist teachers in bringing the last students into Campus Care and locking the gates. This staff member then walks through the school and escorts any unsupervised students to Campus Care.
7. Mrs. Nelson sent an email to the Lunch Duty supervision parent coordinators asking them to send an email to the lunch yard duty volunteers with information about cold weather and rainy day supervision changes and a reminder to include the bathrooms as part of their supervision duty. She had also included this as part of the lunch yard duty orientation meetings that she held with lunch duty volunteers at the beginning of the school year.
8. All rooms now have blinds that replaced the older drapes.
9. New phone system is being installed this week.
10. Yard duty lunch personnel now wear orange vests so that they can be easily seen by students, and portable first aid kits are available.

The audience was allowed to ask questions and Mrs. Chris Oberti asked about yard duty. Mrs. Nelson and Mrs. Smith answered her questions.

Mrs. Nelson's report on security changes made over approximately the past 18 months:

1. Evacuation map approved by Fresno Fire Department and Fresno Police Department.
2. Change security gate code every year.
3. Replaced chain link fence with wrought iron.
4. Added text message feature to School Speak.
5. Require Rooms 21 and 22 to be locked from outside.
6. Added security cameras.
7. Replaced public address speakers.

8. Teachers required to close blinds when leaving.
9. Laminated phone cards.
10. Planning to paint classroom numbers on the roof. Mike Chielpegian to discuss with Mr. Neumeier.

The audience was allowed to ask questions. Mrs. Chris Oberti asked about the number of security cameras and the oleanders near the campus garden. Mrs. Nelson to investigate the oleanders near the campus garden.

The floor was opened to questions or concerns from the audience.

1. Mrs. Marshall commented about the dirtiness of the water fountain by the fields. Mike Chielpegian informed her that this is not a security issue.
2. Mrs. Jenna Oberti asked about the safe word in the event of a lock down.
3. Mrs. Marshall asked about the bathrooms during getting dressed for after school sports.
4. Mrs. Chris Oberti and Mrs. Jenna Oberti complained about the dirtiness of the bathrooms. Mike Chielpegian informed them that this is not a security issue.
5. Mrs. Marshall asked about checking bathrooms during recess and lunch.

Next, the committee discussed the questions raised by Mrs. Becki Burkhart's email to Mike Chielpegian on January 26, 2016.

1. Is Campus Care structured by 30-60 minute blocks? Mrs. Nelson explained that it is.
2. Yard duty was already discussed.
3. Perimeter of school near streets was already discussed.

Next meeting set for February 24, 2016, at 5:30 P.M.
