PSAT for SAS 8th Graders

St. Anthony's School has contracted with the College Board to provide our 8th graders with the opportunity to take the PSAT 8/9 on Wednesday, April 5. This test provides additional practice for our students in taking a standardized test; it is created and scored by the College Board, the organization that creates and scores the SAT College Entrance Exam. The scores from the test predict how a student will do on future standardized tests (e.g. the SAT) and help establish a college readiness baseline. By taking this test, a student is also eligible to create a free, individually-tailored SAT preparation course through the Khan Academy. We wish our 8th graders well during their testing tomorrow!

Congratulations to Our SAS Art Contest Winner

7th grader Kelly Lee was one of the winners in the Annual NOAA Marine Debris Program Art Contest. Her work will be featured in the 2018 Marine Debris Calendar. More than 500 entries were received from K-8 students throughout the United States that contained incredible visual messages on what we need to do to be the solution to ocean pollution. The NOAA Marine Debris Program holds this annual art contest to raise awareness about marine debris, one of the most significant problems our ocean faces today. The resulting calendar, featuring the winning artwork, will be available for download later this year and will help to remind people every day how important it is for us to be responsible stewards of the ocean. Special thanks to Kelly's homeroom teacher, Mr. Jesse Gonzalez, for involving his students in learning experiences regarding marine debris. St. Anthony's School Board Elections

If you are interested in running for the St. Anthony's Advisory School Board, please see the following by-law governing elections. There will be 2 openings for the upcoming year (and positions are a 2 year term.) Please submit your written "statement of qualifications" to a member of the nominating committee, Hillary Bell, Monica Baker, or Christina Linneman by Wednesday April 25th.

Section F: ELECTION OF VOTING MEMBERS: The election format shall be as follows:

1. The President shall appoint a Nominating Committee consisting of three (3) Board members by March 1.
2. By April 1, The Committee shall notify the parents of current students of the upcoming vacancies of the Board and shall request a "statement of qualifications" form any parent interested in serving on the Board. The Nomination Committee shall then develop a slate of candidates who shall meet the following requirements:
 - a.) The Pastor must approve all candidates;
 - b.) The candidate shall be 18 years of age or older;
 - c.) The candidates for elections must be a parent with a child enrolled at St. Anthony's School.
 - d.) The candidate shall not be an employee or spouse of an employee of St. Anthony's School.
 - e.) The candidate shall not have a member of his/her immediate family currently serving as a voting member of the board or running for board membership.
"Immediate family" shall mean father, mother, spouse, brother, sister, or child.
3. The Committee shall inform the school community of the qualifications of the candidate.
4. The Committee under the direct supervision of the Board shall conduct the elections in May. All parents with a child enrolled at St. Anthony's School are eligible to vote.
5. The candidate(s) receiving the highest number of votes shall become a member of the Board on the first regular meeting of the next school year.

**Catholic Bishops of California Ask for Prayers in Observance of
National Crime Victims' Rights Week, April 2-8, 2017**

SACRAMENTO – *Catholic dioceses in California are offering special prayers and Masses in observation of National Crime Victims' Rights Week, an annual event established in 1981 to draw attention to the people and families whose lives have been affected by violent crime. In recognition of those impacted by crime, the Restorative Justice Committee of the California Catholic Conference has issued the following statement. (Members of the Committee are the Most Rev. Richard Garcia, Bishop of Monterey, the Most Rev. Armando Ochoa, Bishop of Fresno, Most Reverend David O'Connell, Auxiliary Bishop of Los Angeles, and the Most Reverend Myron Cotta, Auxiliary Bishop of Sacramento):*

Faith is not a light which scatters all our darkness, but a lamp which guides our steps in the night and suffices for the journey.

– Pope Francis

“The harm to persons by the intentional criminal acts of others can be long lasting. Crime victims, survivors, and their families need to know they are not alone. Local Church communities will walk with them providing support and prayers on the road to healing and restoration.

“Healing is a process aimed at restoring a sense of physical safety, security and their sense of self.

“That process is called ‘restorative justice’. It has two goals—to help victims and their families heal from the traumatic effects of violent crime and to break the cycle of crime by increasing public safety through helping offenders rehabilitate as well as reintegrate into their communities.

“Many California dioceses have an Office of Restorative Justice formed to provide healing and support to all of those affected by crime and the criminal justice system’s response.

“During National Crime Victims’ Rights Week, California dioceses actively work to promote healing opportunities for individuals and communities. Some related activities include interfaith prayer services, candlelight vigils, and Masses for the intentions of crime victims and survivors. In addition, some dioceses are participating in local community-based events to promote awareness of victims’ rights, including related victim marches and conferences.

“As Pope Francis reminds us ‘With the Cross, Jesus unites himself to the silence of the victims of violence, those who can no longer cry out, especially the innocent and the defenseless; with the Cross, he is united to families in trouble, and those who mourn the tragic loss of their children.’”

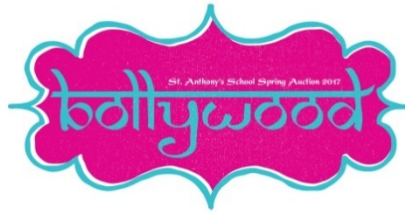
